Our blood drive held on 23 November 2014 had the best results since I have been the blood drive chairman. Our goal was set for 15 units to be collected. We were able to collect 19 units of whole blood and 10 units of double red blood cells. Our total for the year is 54 units of whole blood and 18 units of double red blood cells donated by the post this year. Each unit can save the lives of three people in the local community. Great job 283! Our next blood drive will be held on Saturday 31 January 2015 from 0800-1300. Our goal for the day is set at 20 units. This drive is in conjunction with the state blood drive. If you are unable to give on the day please go to any of the local collection sites and tell them you would like to give it to the American Legion 283 account number 1045. Special thanks to Janice Dixon, Sally King, the SAL, and Auxiliary.

Thanks to all that participated in the Pearl Harbor day remembrance ceremony and the flag retirement that we conducted on 07 December at sunset. We were joined by Terry Parker High School NJROTC, First Coast High School NJROTC and Cub Scout Pack 181. We were successful in retiring 250 flags. Our next flag retirement ceremony will be tentatively scheduled for February in observance of Americanism month. Information on specific dates will be in next newsletter.

It is not too late. The post is still looking for contestants to represent the post in the Oratorical contest to be held in January throughout the 5th District. Our post deadline to have our contest complete is 18 January 2015 with the winner representing us at the District level on 24 January 2015. Your post Disaster Preparedness Team has been working hard to raise money for the National Emergency Fund. In November the amounts of the grants available were increased to \$3000 to Legion family members and \$10,000 to posts impacted by natural disasters. Thanks to Teri and Ron Howard for conducting the Disaster Preparedness dinner on 23 December 2014 on trivia night. Our next dinner will be held on the 31st of January 2015. We hope to see many of you there.

Flag facts for the month are back. Myth: There has been a change to the Flag Code that no longer requires the flag to be properly illuminated during the hours of darkness. The answer is there has been NO change. The Flag Code section 6(a) states, "It is a universal custom to display the flag only from sunrise to sunset on buildings and on stationary flag staffs in the open. However, when a patriotic effect is desired, the flag may be displayed twenty-four hours a day if properly illuminated during the hours of darkness.
