The month of October has arrived. Where has the year gone? The post is still looking for chair persons for all of the programs listed in last month's newsletter. Please contact any of the Legion Officers for information about available positions.

We are looking for students to participate in the post Oratorical Contest. In order to be eligible participants must be citizens of or lawful permanent residents of the United States. All contestants must be bona fide students herein described as any student under the age of 20 years on the date of the national contest who is presently enrolled in a high school or junior high school (public, parochial, military, private or home school). The curriculum of the school must be considered to be of high school level, commencing with grade 9 and terminating with grade 12. Students must be enrolled in high school or

junior high school during the time of participation at any level of The American Legion National High School Oratorical Contest. Contestants must either be legally domiciled within or attend an educational institution within the department that they enter competition. Contestants can enter competition through only one department. High school students that graduate early during the school year are eligible to compete if they are not enrolled in a college, university, trade school or other institution of higher learning at the time of the department finals contest. Further information can be obtained at www.legion.org/oratorical/rules.

We are also looking for delegates to represent the post in the Boys State program. To be eligible to participate in Boys State, only males who have successfully completed their junior year of high school and who have at least one more semester remaining are considered. Previous participants of a Boys State competition are not allowed to attend a second session. Only those who illustrate leadership, character, scholarship, loyalty and service in their schools and community should be considered. Merit and ability are the basis for evaluation during the actual citizens selection process. More information can be found at www.legion.org/boysnation/stateeligibility.
